

Nathan became a part of the CVSO team in February of 2012, Nathan previously was a part of the Concord Vet Center team as a Readjustment Counselor providing both individual and group therapy for combat Veterans and their family members. Nathan served in the Marine Corps with a combat tour in Iraq. After the Marine Corps, Nathan earned his BA in Communications at CSU Stanislaus and his MSW at UC Berkeley.

Denver F. Mills, Concord Vet Center Team Leader. Denver is a Vietnam Veteran who served as an advisor to South Vietnamese small boat operations. He has a B.A. from U.C. Berkeley in Interdisciplinary Studies, an M.A. from U.C. Santa Barbara in Public Affairs and another M.A from Newport University in Psychology. He has been running VA programs for the treatment of PTSD since 1985 and is also involved with helping homeless Veterans.

Town of Danville Mayor CANDACE ABDERSEN Appointed by Governor to County Board of Supervisors

In a Press Release by **Danville's Town Manager** - **Joe Calabrigo** he announced this week...

Danville **Mayor Candace Andersen** has been appointed to fill the remaining term of District 2 Supervisor Gayle Uilkema. Andersen, who received 60% of the vote in the June primary was to have taken the seat in January, however Monday evening she was asked by California State Governor Jerry Brown's office to begin the term as of June 26, 2012.

Monday evening Andersen informed Town Manager Joe Calabrigo of the appointment and resigned her position on the Town Council. At their regularly scheduled meeting Tuesday morning, the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors accepted the appointment and Andersen was sworn in by Contra Costa County Clerk Steve Weir.

At their next regular meeting on July 3, 2012, the Town Council will select a new Mayor and Vice-Mayor to fill out the remainder of the terms, which end December 4, 2012. Andersen's seat will remain vacant through December, with a new council member being chosen in the November General Election.

New Mental Health center at VA Palo Alto Health Care System Opens

WASHINGTON (June 25, 2012)— The Department of Veterans Affairs Under Secretary for Health, Dr. Robert Petzel joined Veterans, staff and congressional representatives on June 22 to open a state-of-the-art, 80-bed acute mental health center at the VA Palo Alto Health Care System.

"This new facility will ensure that California's Veterans continue to have access to high-quality mental health care that they earned through their service to our Nation," said Petzel. "This is a priority for the American people. It's a priority for the Department of Veterans Affairs. And there is nothing more important to me than making sure America's Veterans receive the health care and services they need and deserve."

The new center, on the Palo Alto campus, will provide a continuum of mental health services, from inpatient to outpatient, with an additional research component. The 90,000 square-foot facility will house four units, each with 20 inpatient acute psychiatric beds. The project also includes outdoor enclosed gardens for the patients, a separate mental health research and office pavilion and a utility building to service the complex. Most rooms are private, with some semi-private, and all have private bathrooms.

"This new facility is like day and night to the current one," said Christopher Hurt, 25, an Iraq War combat Veteran and patient. "I've heard other people say they've never seen a facility this nice. It's bright, airy and just makes the healing process so much nicer. It even has a work-out room and basketball court. I love it."

The building's therapeutic design and healing environments were the result of collaboration with clinicians and considering the perspective of the Veterans who will receive care in the facility. Features to enhance the treatment of Veterans can be found throughout the project, including patient access to landscaped gardens, ample use of natural light in all internal patient and staff areas, views to landscaped areas from all patient bedrooms, color, texture and material palettes selected to aid in the healing process. Last year, VA provided quality, specialty mental health services to 1.3 million Veterans. Since 2009, VA has increased the mental health care budget by 39 percent. Since 2007, VA has seen a 35 percent increase in the number of Veterans receiving mental health services, and a 41 percent increase in mental health staff.

In April, as part of an ongoing review of mental health operations, Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki announced VA would add approximately 1,600 mental health clinicians as well as nearly 300 support staff to its existing workforce of 20,590 to help meet the increased demand for mental health services. The additional staff would include nurses, psychiatrists, psychologists and social workers

Homes Donated by Bank Millions of Americans paused this Memorial Day weekend to remember those who died while serving their country. But for six military veterans and their families, Memorial Day also marked the beginning of a new era of homeownership as they received keys to mortgage-free homes.

The homes, which were provided by Chase, were awarded by three nonprofit organizations: Building Homes for Heroes, Military Warriors Support Foundation and Operation Home front.

VNVDV Veterans Plan Return to VietNam in 2012

Help Support the VNVDV's Wheelchairs for VietNam... Wheelchair Foundation Distribution



The team of **Viet Nam Veterans of Diablo Valley members** November 2012, return to Vietnam are moving along quickly. The VNVDV is honored to once again partner with the **Wheelchair Foundation** on this journey to distribute approximately 240 wheelchairs to those in need, at pre-screened agencies with East Meets West throughout Vietnam.

The timeframe for this trip is **November 5 to 21, 2012**. The cost for this trip will be personally paid by each individual member—using no organizational funds. The cost for each member is approximately **\$3,000 to \$3,500**, per person. The one plus is the cost of the trip may be tax deductible, as we will be on a volunteer, charitable mission in conjunction with the **Wheelchair Foundation**. The VietNam travelers are encouraged to consult their tax adviser for further details.

There was space available for **20** to make the journey. Since space was limited, the travel group filled quickly. Since more than 20 desired to make the trip, some members may have to be placed on a waiting list. Also a criteria will be set to determine travel priority. An initial deposit of **\$1,000**, **per individual** was required two month earlier and last month an **additional \$1000**, **per person** was required. The airline tickets have already been purchased for the all the distribution travelers, and a third payment will be due in the near future. All travelers met recently for a dinner hosted by Skip & Liz George and paid for by each of the travelers. Many thanks to Skip & Liz for their hospitality.

Travelers are now encouraged to check the travel website and begin the process of obtaining the required shots and immunizations for travel to rural areas throughout VietNam. Those enrolled in the VA Health Care System should check with their Primary Care Doctors in Martinez for assistance. If you have questions about travel requirements contact Joel Hodge at the Wheelchair Foundation.

The VNVDV is working with *East Meets West* to conduct distribution of wheelchairs from the south to North - with possible side trips to visit locations where they served, during the War. The VNVDV team will arrive in Saigon (Ho Chi Minh City), with possible visits to Can Tho, Quy Nhon, Hue, Ha Long Bay and Hanoi prior to their return prior to Thanksgiving. This group will miss Veterans Day in Danville.

The **2012** trip will be the **VNVDV**'s **second return to Vietnam**. In 2006, nine (9) VNVDV members and their spouses/significant others made the memorable journey. Everyone who made this trip in 2006 felt that it not only helped the veterans, but also dramatically improved the life of those who received a wheelchair, as well as the benefits to their caregivers and families.

During the 2006 journey, impromptu "group sessions" were held to discuss veterans' memories, feelings, and observations. More importantly, spouses/significant others were involved in many of these discussions, contributing to the healing experience of any leftover war time issues.

The VNVDV team is looking for ways to raise additional funds to assist some of the orphanages & technical training schools as they did during their 2006 distribution trip. There will be additional updates and meetings for the travelers for planning. 
