APRIL Guest Speaker - Author Kenneth Levin

The featured Guest Speaker for our March 7th dinner meeting will be Kenneth Levin - Author of "Crazy Razor". This is a tale of two young service men during the Viet Nam war who just happen to be on "opposite" sides during the war. *Don't miss this very interesting quest speaker at our dinner meeting!*

Author Kenneth Levin is a decorated combat veteran of the war in Vietnam whose blindness forced him to retire from the US Navy with the rank of Commander. A student of the Vietnam War, he completed several drafts of Crazy Razor before traveling to Hanoi, Hoi An, and Cu Chi to interview Viet Cong and NVA veterans and their children to incorporate their experiences in the novel's final draft. Originally from Chicago, he holds degrees from Washington University in St. Louis and the US Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California. He and his wife live in Oakland, California.

Author Kenneth Levin's bracingly honest and harrowing debut is reminiscent of masterworks like Tim O'Brien's The Things They Carried and Bao Ninh's The Sorrow of War. A decorated combat veteran whose his own experiences in Vietnam are combined with the personal interviews of North Vietnamese veterans, Levin deftly explores the nature of man amidst the chaos and horror of war. As illuminating as it is disturbing, Crazy Razor demonstrates with stark clarity that the real villain in war...is war itself.

A bit of the book... "Crazy Razor"

Who do you think will win this war?" The different reasons for participating in the Vietnam War between four major groups—the American army, the Army of the Republic of Vietnam (ARVN), the North Vietnamese Army (NVA), and the Viet Cong (VC)—could not be more stark. As much as one approaches it as a war like any other, its mirror opposite sees it more of what war is really about: the struggle between life and death with no compromise. There is no retreat or surrender for those fighting for North Vietnam. There are no weekend passes for R&R, no trips back home after a year, and no returns to base camp for a meal and a shower. There is only squatting hungry in the bush, waiting for the opportunity to kill or be killed—and that's it. These dualities feed off each other in ways far more significant than strategy and tactics can provide summation for.

This is an exciting book - with great reviews - we hope you will join us for dinner!



VA HOME LOAN information from the County Veterans Service Office -

Stable housing leads to long-term stability, which factors into reliability and other characteristics of successful employees. Are you aware that loans guaranteed by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Home Loan Program have had the lowest foreclosure rate in the past 19 quarters compared to all other types of home loans? This is pretty significant given the trials & tribulations of the housing market during the past several years.

Did you know the VA's Home Loan Program Benefit is not a one-time benefit, but can be reused? Since 1944, more than 20 million Veterans and Service Members have enjoyed the benefit of a home purchase through the VA Home Loan program. Veterans who have already used their VA benefit in their home purchase may reuse that benefit to purchase another residence, or to refinance to a lower rate. This is referred to as an Interest Rate Reduction Refinance Loan (IRRRL) or Streamline Refinance Loan. No appraisal or credit underwriting is required.

Consider this: If a Veteran used their benefit, perhaps while on active duty, to purchase a home, they should compare their interest rate with current rates in their area. That Veteran can reuse their VA benefit to refinance their home with "no money out of pocket," as costs may be included in the loan. If that Veteran has since separated or retired from the military and receives disability compensation of at least 10%, he or she is exempt from the funding fee. This can be a considerable monthly or total savings for the Veteran. On average, Veterans saved more than \$200 per monthly payment on IRRRLs last year, saving those Veterans over \$900 million in their first two years alone! Veterans may obtain a Certificate of Eligibility through our office, online through eBenefits, or through their lender. I encourage Veterans to seek the advice of a financial professional and to contact several lenders for quotes to determine what is in their best interest. The Distinguished Warfare Medal

Pentagon's New Medal Draws Criticism

A new medal approved by Defense Secretary Leon E. Panetta just over a week ago was not welcomed by everyone.

The Distinguished Warfare Medal, which will be awarded for support of combat operations by drone pilots, cyber warfare troops and the like, has been ripped for its position in the military's "order of precedence," according to a report in Army Times.

The medal will rank just below the **Distinguished Flying Cross** and have precedence over the **Bronze Star with Valor** device. It also will rank above the **Purple Heart**, awarded for being wounded or killed in action.

"This award recognizes the reality of the kind of technological warfare we are engaged in in the 21st century," Panetta said last week.

But several people recently told publisher of Army Times that the ranking is wrong.

"Medals that can only be earned in direct combat must mean more than medals awarded in the rear," said VFW National Commander John Hamilton.

Military Times Hall of Valor curator Doug Sterner, said, "I understand the need to recognize guys at the console who are doing some pretty important things. But to see it ranking above the Bronze Star [with] V?"

Lt. Cmdr. Nate Christensen, Pentagon spokesman, told the Army & Navy Times the medal will be limited to "achievements that are truly extraordinary."

"The DWM is visionary in that it fills a need for a non-valorous combat impact medal," Christensen added.


Benghazi Rescue Depicted in New Film; 'Kickstarter' Funding Sought"


WASHINGTON, DC— "Siege at Benghazi" chronicles the daring rescue mission at the U.S. Diplomatic Mission and the subsequent battle at a nearby CIA facility in Libya on the night of 9/11/2012. American and Canadian companies have joined forces to dramatize these heroic actions. Their mission was to create a new visual style for recreating Special Operations missions, without huge Hollywood budgets. With consultants from varied Special Operations and Intelligence backgrounds, HistoriVision, based in the Washington, DC area, and Whipsnap Films and Thoughtform Digital, both of Toronto, Canada, teamed up to create the short film. Weather delays and late-breaking details of the action prompted film makers to add extra shooting days, and turn to the popular crowd-source funding site Kickstarter to raise additional funds to complete the project. HistoriVision's 30 day campaign was launched on February 18, 2013, and has set a target to raise at least \$250,000 to finish the film. The movie trailer and Kickstarter campaign can be seen here:

"We think a lot of people want to see the story told without the politics," said HistoriVision Co-Executive Producer Rich Ware. "The CIA teams fought off a concerted attack and saved a lot of lives," said Jeff Hix, HistoriVision Co-Executive Producer, "People hold these American heroes in awe and want to see how they pulled it off." Whipsnap and Thoughtform are known for creating cinematic film shorts related to the Call of Duty Modern Warfare video game plot. "Find Makarov" and "Operation Kingfish" fused live action and video game style visual effects and garnered over ten million views on the internet. "We are bringing that same look to 'Siege at Benghazi," said Thoughtform's Jacky Wan. HISTORIVISION

"Siege at Benghazi" was filmed at "Strategic Operations" studio and other locations in San Diego County in December 2012. The film makers plan to finish the project this Spring and then widely distribute it on new media platforms, or as part of a more ambitious broadcast offering.

Vietnam Veterans may have been exposed to a variety of environmental and chemical hazards that carried potential health risks. VA offers eligible Veterans a <u>free</u> Agent Orange Registry health exam for possible long-term health problems related to herbicide exposure.

Agent Orange or Other Herbicides

Herbicides used to destroy foliage and crops

Noise

Harmful sounds from guns, equipment, and machinery that is often experienced during military service

Hepatitis C

Vietnam-era Veterans are at risk for hepatitis C. Talk to your provider about getting tested.

Occupational Hazards

Exposures from working with chemicals, paints, and machinery during service

Others

<u>Editor's Note</u>: The VA offer to eligible VietNam Veterans of FREE Agent Orange Registry health exam for possible long-term health problems related to herbicide exposure <u>is NOT based on Income</u>. 


