Message from our VNVDV "Prez" - "Slatts"

Welcome to December's **INCOMING**. As always a number of member volunteers have been busy with activities for our *Operation Welcome Home* events and also continued planning meetings for up coming events in 2014. I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving celebration with family and friends and that everyone is safe and healthy.

Our November dinner speaker at *Crow Canyon Country Club* was our own member **Earle Conklin** who shared with us the logistics of our Veteran Swim Challenge the VNVDV helped sponsor from Alcatraz to San Francisco in the month of October. He brought 2 veterans who took the challenge swimming with him and shared with us the feeling of accomplishment they experienced participating in and completing this swim challenge. Both of these young veterans spoke from the heart and it was very moving to hear them share their stories. The event was a huge success for all the veterans who participated as they completed a swim challenge that few people have attempted or accomplished.

Veterans Day (always on Nov 11th at 11 am) was another successful recognition of all veterans. The major program for the Diablo Valley was held at San Ramon Valley High School's Performance Art Theater in Danville. This was a joint VSO effort with planning & participation by VFW, MCL, AI along with the VNVDV & Blue Star Moms. Our VP **Ray LaRochelle** was MC of the program with **Col. Allan Cruz, USMC** (ret) from Marine Corp League #942 as the main speaker... sharing many facts about the Viet Nam war. BSM sharing her views of that time was **Georgann Seavey** who was a flight attendant for *Flying Tiger Airlines*. She spoke of what it was like to bring a plane full of soldiers to Viet Nam and then flying another plane full of men back to the US who had served their year in Viet Nam and the difference in the attitudes of the men in those flights. *It was a talk shared from her heart.* The Chorus of the San Ramon Valley High School performed one of the finest patriotic medlies of songs & music we had the pleasure of hearing. Along with that program, the Veteran Memorial Building Library & Historical Museum was open on Sat (11/9) from 9 am to 3 pm and again Sunday and Monday (11/10 & 11/11) from noon to 3 pm with special displays of military uniforms, vehicles, communications equipment and other items. It was well attended by hundreds of Diablo Valley families & lots of children learning about history from their parents & docents at the VMB.

Prior to the Veterans Day weekend the Pleasanton VFW post hosted a Veterans Day parade in Pleasanton the VNVDV participated in on Sunday, Nov 3. Thanks to all members who showed up & carried their military service colors & our VNVDV banner letting the parade attendees know who we are & how proud we were to have served our country.

We recently had two welcome home events in November, one for a Corpsman & one for a Navy fighter pilot. Viet Nam Warrior Statistical Profile from Presentation

IN UNIFORM AND IN COUNTRY

- Vietnam Vets: 8.7% of their generation.
- 9,087,000 military personnel served on active duty during the Vietnam era (Aug. 5, 1964 – May 7, 1975).
- 8,744,000 personnel were on active duty during the war (Aug. 5, 1964 – March 28, 1973).
- 3,403,100 (including 514,300 officers) personnel served in the Southeast Asia Theater (Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, Thailand and sailors in adjacent South China Sea waters).
- 2,584,000 personnel served within the borders of South Vietnam (Jan. 1, 1965 – March 28, 1973).
- Of the 2.6 million, between 1 and 1.6 million (40–60%) either fought in combat, provided close combat support or were at least fairly regularly exposed to enemy attack. 15% were in combat units.
- Another 50,000 men served in Vietnam between 1960 and 1964.
- 7,181 women (6,250 or 83.5% were nurses) served in Vietnam.
- Peak troop strength in Vietnam: 543,482 (April 30, 1969).

CASUALTIES

- Hostile deaths: 47,418.
- Non-hostile deaths: 10,811.
- Total: 58,229 (includes men formerly classified as MIA and *Mémoires* casualties). Men who have subsequently died of wounds account for the changing total.
- 8 nurses died — 1 was KIA.
- Married men killed: 17,539.
- 61% of the men killed were 21 years old or younger.
- Highest state death rate: West Virginia — 84.1 per 100,000 males (national average in 1970: 58.0).
- Wounded: 303,704 — 153,329 hospital-

ized + 150,375 injured who required no hospital care.

- Severely disabled: 75,000 — 23,214 100% disabled; 5,283 lost limbs; 1,081 sustained multiple amputations.
- Amputation or crippling wounds to the lower extremities were 300% higher than in WWII and 70% higher than in Korea. Multiple amputations occurred at the rate of 18.4% compared to 5.7% in WWII.
- Missing in Action: 2,338 (at war's end).
- Prisoners of War: 708 (114 died in captivity).

DRAFTEES VS. VOLUNTEERS

- 25% (648,500) of total forces in country were draftees. (88% of U.S. armed forces members in WWII were drafted.)
- Draftees accounted for 30.4% (17,725) of combat deaths in Vietnam.
- Reservists killed: 5,977.
- National Guard: 9,000 served; 22 KIA.

RACE AND ETHNIC BACKGROUND

- 88.4% of the men who actually served in Vietnam were Caucasian (includes Hispanics); 10.6% (275,000) were black; 1% belonged to other races.
- 85.3% of the men who died in Vietnam were Caucasian; 12.5% (7,241) were black; 1.2% belonged to other races.
- 170,000 Hispanics served in Vietnam; 3,070 (5.2% of total) died there.
- 85.8% of the men who were killed as a result of hostile action were Caucasian; 12.1% (5,711) were black; 1.1% belonged to other races.
- 14.8% (11,530) of non-combat deaths were among blacks.
- 34% of blacks who enlisted volunteered for the combat arms.
- Overall, blacks suffered 12.5% of the deaths in Vietnam at a time when the

percentage of blacks of military age was 13.5% of the total population.

- Religion of dead: Protestants — 64.4%; Catholic — 28.9%; other/none — 1.7%.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC STATUS

- 78% of the men sent to Vietnam were from lower middle/working class backgrounds.
- Three-fourths had family incomes above the poverty level; 50% were from middle-income backgrounds.
- Some 23% of Vietnam vets had fathers with professional, managerial or technical occupations.
- 79% of the men who served in Vietnam had a high school education or better when they entered the military service. (83% of Korean War vets and only 45% of WWII vets had completed high school upon separation.)

WINNING & LOSING

- 82% of veterans who saw heavy combat strongly believe the war was lost because of lack of political will.
- Nearly 75% of the general public agrees that it was a failure of political will, not of arms.

AGE & HONORABLE SERVICE

- Average age of the Vietnam War GI: 19 (26 for WWII).
- 92% of Vietnam era veterans were honorably discharged.

PRIDE IN SERVICE

- 91% of actual Vietnam War veterans and 90% of those who saw heavy combat are proud to have served their country.
- 66% of Vietnam vets say they would serve again if called upon (pollied in the 1980s).
- 87% of the public now holds Vietnam veterans in high esteem.

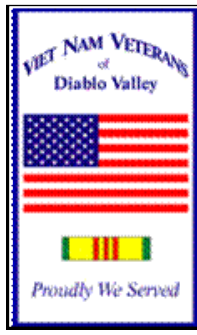

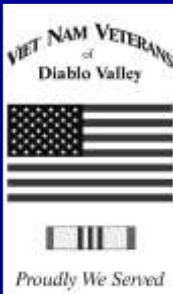
