

キャャャャャャャャャャャャャ ***** A Rare opportunity to hear True-Life **History from VNVDV's July Dinner** Meeting Featured Speaker Pearl Harbor Survivor Chuck Kohler



"Go to the top of Mount Diablo and light the light"

This is the last line of a poem of a poem written by Pearl Harbor survivor E. J. "Chuck" Kohler. At this very moment the Mount Diablo Searchlight is being renovated so that it will shine again on every December 7th as a reminder that we should never forget that date in 1941 when the Lapanese attacked Pearl Harbor.

Chuck Kohler was there that day, a 17 year old farm boy from Minnesota. That morning he was up early and snuck into an office to type a letter to his mother. As planes flew by, he thought nothing of it, for he was stationed on Ford Island Naval Air Base in the middle of Pearl Harbor.

An explosion sent glass and debris throughout the office and Chuck realized something was * terribly wrong. The flashing lights on the airplane wings turned out to be bullets being fired from planes that he suddenly noticed had a large red sun on the starboard side.

Chuck hurried out of the building and confronted the duty officer who ordered him into to take cover in a nearby construction ditch. Not wanting his family to hear that "he died hiding instead of fighting", Chuck decided to disobey a direct order. He grabbed a nearby Aviation Ordnance man, who Chuck could see had a key for the Ammo shack, and the two of them 💏 grabbed a 50 cal. and ammo and headed back out....

Remember - the parade is <u>Thursday</u>... at 9AM - the parade "kick-off" time is earlier - It will start at 0900 on JULY 4TH in Danville and streets will be closed earlier. Remember... to arrive on-time for muster at 0800 at the parking lot near the rear of Performing Arts Center off Love Lane. No vehicles will be authorized in this area. Park at the Church or at the end of the parade and catch the shuttle down to the start before 8AM that morning. Procurement Director Bill Green tells us he has a few of our *Official* VNVDV white ball caps available at the July 4th parade. Remember Wear or Bring Sunscreen - we will have Ice Water courtesy of Marty DeVenuta. We need ALL MEMBERS POSSIBLE to show up for this event. We purchase 10,000 American Flags to distribute to the school children along the parade route again this year. This will take every able bodied member we have and we need your help so please attend the parade ready to help out wearing your white polo shirt to <u>representing our organization!</u> As you continue to improve the image of all Viet Nam veterans. You are authorized to wear your military ribbons—medals-devices on your shirts on major holidays. The DOD and VA encourages you to show your pride in your military service. Remember... "Proudly We Served" See you at the Parade.



Danville's annual *Kiwanis* 4th of July Parade is coming up this week - Thursday! According to VNVDV VP Ray LaRochelle also serving as 2013 Parade Chair - <u>ALL</u> <u>MEMBERS are encouraged to attend</u> - to assist in distributing the 10,000 plus AMERICAN FLAGS we purchased to the thousands of children who attend this event.

To maintain our organizational image all members are requested to wear the official



VNVDV White Polo Golf Shirt (DOD & VA also encouraged veterans to wear your military ribbons, medals & devices on all holidays). This is a great Welcome Home event for every veteran attending! This crowd truly honors the veterans in our community.

Our Military Service Colors... to those who are volunteering for the Military Service Colors Team and will be carrying your Service Branch Flag in the parade... be sure your in our official uniform consisting of the VNVDV white shirts—dark blue cotton slacks / shorts - white tennis shoes & our VNVDV white ball cap. ALL VETERAN & Military Units are to *muster* at the parking lot just off Love Lane behind the Performing Arts Center at the SRV High School no later than 0800 for instruction. The parade will start this year at 9:00 AM Sharp! Our VNVDV Service Color Unit and Banner will take eight men... and we will need another forty or fifty to conduct our *annual distribution* of 10,000 American Flags to the school children along the parade route again this year. As our President said in his message... This is an "All Hands" effort - encouraging's all members to attend the parade

Leading our group in the parade will be the Concord USMC Color Guard from Concord - followed by our VNVDV Organizational Banner and our VNVDV members carrying the Military Service Branch Colors - followed by the MIA/POW Flag. We are once again extremely fortunate to have with us this year an outstanding ARMY Band - 1st Detachment of the 40th Infantry Division ARMY Band - **also known as the "Governors Own" providing traditional patriotic music throughout the parade. The VNVDV 1949 Pa**rade Truck - **known as the "Flagmobile" will be loaded and transporting the 10,000 plus American Flags for distribution to the children along the parade route. The parade truck will also be carrying ice water for our members. Our "Flag Mobile" is a 1949 International Harvester KB-1 Pick-Up Truck, hopefully moving slowly along with the VNVDV members distributing flags to allow they re "re-load" throughout the parade route. The truck also transports the flags and service colors and banners to and from the parade site. Following the Parade Truck will be the D.A.R. - the Daughter's of The American Revolution join us this year to carry the very large 20' x 38' "Garrison Flag," covering the entire street. The mobile & educational Concord VET Center UH -1 Huey Helicopter Sponsored by AMVETS Post #26 joins the VNVDV again this year in the parade and it will be loaded with "scouts" from Troop 1776 from San Ramon Valley proudly riding aboard the Huey. The large & long UH-1 Huey will be escorted and who better than our very own Warriors Watch Riders . This year the WWR may include their "tribute vehicles" honoring the Blue Angels—Remembering 9/11 and our MIA/POW with these special Vettes. Plus this year we will have a military Jeep - restored to round-out the VNVDV entry in this 2013 Parade and salute to "Service to Others"**

Note: This year the parade ends at Sycamore Valley and all veteran and military units will turn RIGHT into the LIVERY at Sycamore Valley. The only units going straight will be large and long floats that cannot make the turn such as the HUEY & its escorts - all others will turn rights and we will "break-down all gear" in The Livery at the "Flag Mobile."

Remember DO NOT STOP in the middle of the street—move to the side and CLEAR the area as soon as possible after the parade to allow other units to move forward. **Personal reminder... please "HAND" all flags out personally** - DO NOT throw or toss flags

The VNVDV is providing lunch for the 40th Infantry Division Army Band and USMC Color Guard <u>ONLY</u> following the parade. Ray has worked hard on coordinating this years event and asks for everyone's cooperation. It will be *HOT* so be sure to bring your *VNVDV hat* or *buy one*... and don't forget the sunscreen! As recommended by the *Kiwanis Parade Committee* - we will have "*ice water*" in the back of the Parade Truck with the extra flags. Parking near the start of the parade is available at St. Isadora's Catholic Church - since all streets will be closed before 0800. Shuttle Buses will be *near the Fire House* at the end of the parade on Hartz for return to the parade start. A Veteran BBQ is being held at the Veterans Memorial Building for all veterans following the parade. This is sponsored by the VFW Post 75 beginning at 10:30AM. Also for all VNVDV members who participated

in the Danville Parade - Bill & Peg Green are hosting their annual pot-luck picnic at their home after the parade - begin-

Sentinels of Freedom Scholarship Foundation Update




