

JUNE Guest Speaker - Captain David Yuers

June 6th at our dinner, Captain David Yuers will be speaking at dinner for the VNVDV

A local, David Yuers was born In Oakland, raised in Lafayette, and attended schools in Pleasant Hill, Concord and finally, San Francisco State University. Growing up, Yuers dreamed about one day becoming a pilot, and was most proud of the aviation merit badge he received in Boy Scouts. Because of a vision loss, Yuers was not able to realize his dream and in 1982 he joined the U.S. Air Force as an enlisted and became an Aircraft Weapons Chief. He left the regular Air Force in 1992 and joined the Air National Guard in 1994.



From 1994 through 2004, he was stationed with the California Air National Guard's 129th Combat Search and Rescue Wing at Moffett Federal Air Field. He trained to become an all-source intelligence analyst and worked with the California Department of Justice, Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement in San Jose as an Air National Guard liaison.

In 2004, Yuers earned a commission in the United States Air Force Reserve and is presently stationed at Nellis Air Force Base, Nevada.

His decorations include the Air Force Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award (with valor) and the Operation Iraqi Freedom Campaign Medal.

Captain Yuers now lives in Walnut Creek and is presently assigned at Nellis Air Force Base working at the 547th Intelligence Squadron. His last deployment, February to August 2012, was to Camp Lemonnier, Djibouti,

Africa. As guest speaker Captain Yuers will be enlightening us on WHAT IS GOING ON IN AFRICA.

Djibouti, officially the Republic of Djibouti, is a small desert country located at the south entrance of the Red Sea in the Horn of Africa. It is bordered by Eritrea in the north, Ethiopia in the west and south, and Somalia in the southeast. The remainder of the border is formed by the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden at the east. Djibouti occupies only a total area of just 8,958 square miles, but is strategically located near the world's busiest shipping lanes, controlling access to the Red Sea and Indian Ocean. It serves as a key refueling and transshipment center, and is the principal maritime port for imports to and exports from neighboring Ethiopia. A burgeoning commercial hub, the nation is the site of various foreign military bases, including Camp Lemonnier.

Djibouti's importance stems from its strategic location at the entrance to the Bab al Mandeb. The country's air-field served as part of a strategic air bridge for operations in Somalia, and the US has an ongoing ship visit program. Djibouti's pro-Western orientation and long-standing French presence afford the U.S. important access to support facilities for crisis response.

"GWOT" (Global War on Terrorism) Veteran Weekend Duck Club Retreat Sponsored by the VietNam Veterans



UH-1 Huey as it approached the LZ at Monte Vista High School VNVDV member Joe Callaway invited his grand-children to come out to see the helicopter land. Joe was aboard & wearing a family WW II jacket & his own Vietnam field jacket (yes - it was cool & windy) as the Vietnam Helicopter's fully-restored Huey made multiple, special educational history visits in the Diablo Valley to further education & keeping history alive & interesting for students.

During May, San Ramon Valley High School juniors study the Vietnam War... and the VNVDV along with Vietnam Helicopters, made this history lesson "real"... transporting veterans who actually served in multiple conflicts. This "flight team" included two Pearl Harbor Survivors - Korean War veteran - "assorted" Vietnam veterans & one pilot who served in the Gulf War. 

Navy Donates Wheelchairs to Vets Visiting Memorial

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- When the Navy cancelled Continuing Promise 2013 deployment due to sequestration, 280 brand-new wheelchairs from The Wheelchair Foundation, provided for the deployment mission to 4th Fleet Area of Responsibility (AOR), no longer had a final destination.

Turns out these wheelchairs were just what some American Veterans needed for their visit to the World War II Memorial in Washington D.C. The Tallahassee, Florida, Chapter of the Honor Flight Network was planning a trip for Veterans from the Tallahassee area, but needed wheelchairs for the mission.

The Honor Flight Network is a non-profit organization that transports American Veterans to Washington D.C. to visit their memorials, with the priority being to senior Veterans such as World War II survivors.

"We need wheelchairs because the youngest of our World War II Veterans is 85 years old," said Captain Scott Barry, Special Operations Director for the Leon County Florida Emergency Management Service. "The wheelchairs allow us to safely transport many of the Veterans and help keep them comfortable as they go from place to place."

Capt. Barry contacted the Fort Lauderdale, Fla. Chapter of the Wheelchair Foundation, who had provided the 280 wheelchairs to U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command/U.S. Fourth Fleet (USNAVSO/FOURTHFLT) for Continuing Promise 2013. After a few phone calls and emails, the wheelchairs, located in Norfolk, Virginia, were redirected to the Honor Flight Network.

But one hurdle remained how to get the wheelchairs loaded onto trucks in Norfolk and taken to Tallahassee in time for the Veterans' trip to Washington, D.C. That's where a group of Fleet Logistic Center Norfolk volunteers contributed their time and talents to palletize the wheelchairs and stage them for shipment. Approximately 20 Sailors and civilians loaded approximately 35 Pallets on two United Parcel Service semi-trucks for the trip to Tallahassee.

On May 11th, 79 Veterans made the trip to Washington, D.C. Volunteers from the Honor Flight Network, greeted the Veterans at the Tallahassee and Baltimore airports, and provided a police escort to and from the Memorial, all to say thank you for their service. "Many of the Veterans told me this was one, if not best day of their lives," said Capt. Barry. "Not only did they get to visit the Memorial but also made connections with other Vets in our area and now will continue to support each other in their final years."

"We are pleased that we were able to play a small role in helping these American heroes see their Memorial," said Rear Admiral Sinclair Harris, Commander U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command/Commander U.S. 4th Fleet. Harris went on to say.

"We like to say that we do real work to help real people to make a real difference, and in this instance, we were fortunate to have just what the Honor Flight Network needed for a memorable day."

U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command and U.S. 4th Fleet supports USSOUTHCOM joint and combined full-spectrum military operations by providing principally sea-based, forward presence to ensure freedom of maneuver in the maritime domain, to foster and sustain cooperative relationships with international partners and to fully exploit the sea as maneuver space in order to enhance regional security and promote peace, stability, and prosperity in the Caribbean, Central and South American regions.


