East Bay Stand Down 2014 needs volunteers

Homeless Veteran Support Event has urgent need for community volunteers for Sept. 11 - 14

Pleasanton – Organizers of the East Bay Stand Down are in the final stages of a major community initiative to help end homelessness by assisting displaced veterans and their families. Additional community volunteers are still needed! Advance registration of over two thousand volunteers to help extended until midnight on Sept. 3rd. This large-scale support program takes place at the Alameda County Fairgrounds in Pleasanton from September 11 through September 14, a four-day / 24-hour encampment. Concerned citizens, community organizations, clubs, non-profit groups and business organizations are needed to assist in supporting through volunteering to assist the VA & Military in establishing and operating a "tent city" for 450 homeless at the fairgrounds. Volunteers make a major difference in this program.

"Stand Down" is a term used during war to describe the practice of removing combat troops from the field and taking care of their basic needs in a safe area. This same concept has been successfully used at EBSD to provide assistance to veterans who are on the streets or close to losing jobs, family connections, and housing.

Volunteers & support is needed in all areas. Jobs include preparing & serving meals, full-time tent leaders, escorting veterans to appointments, advance camp set-up & post break-down of camp - and many other key support functions are needed throughout the four-day event. In addition to volunteers, East Bay Stand Down is also looking for additional financial support, loan of equipment and services. Major Sponsorship & Tent Sponsors may also be available for businesses & non-profits at EBSD 2014.

The East Bay Stand Down (EBSD) is the only four-day homeless events of its kind in the nation, serving up to 450 men & women veterans and their families. Advance screening ensures eligibility & verifies need; new participants are bussed-in from various points throughout the Bay Area and transported to the event site. Once checked-in, the participating Veterans will receive food, clothing, shelter, showers, haircuts and other basic necessities. VA and Military Health Care providers will be available to assist with physical, dental, and mental health needs & counselors are present to address substance abuse issues, housing and employment options, veteran's benefits, legal issues and spiritual concerns.

Since the first EBSD in 1999, these **non-profit, all volunteer** events have continued on a bi-annual basis, and have proven to be uniquely effective in helping to break the cycle of homelessness among some Veterans. The objective of the EBSD is to place 30 percent of the eligible participants directly into follow-on programs. Opportunities that can lead to direct employment are provided. Participants connect directly with community agencies during the event - helping with stabilization of the participants' lives, helping these Veterans to come-in off the street & again become productive.

According to Jerry Yahiro, Director of the East Bay Stand Down, "volunteers are the lifeblood of this program & extend the ability of the program to work with the maximum number of veterans on a limited budget." "Many of our volunteers come back year after year" - he said, "There is a great sense of accomplishment, camaraderie, & team spirit among those who volunteer to work the event." For those who would like to become involved in the September 2014 event visit the East Bay Stand Down website & register to Volunteer prior to Sept. 3rd - all volunteer positions are posted on the website - and registration is required in advance.



Brandon Del Fiorentino, a Marine injured in Iraq 2004, survived a drive-by shooting and is now recovering. Brandon's Iraq injuries include spinal, brain & eye damage. He has been through a successful but difficult recovery complicated with PTSD.

Brandon is the father of five children - including an infant daughter. He had ben working in San Jose with a film and video production company.

Mike Conklin, Sentinels of Freedom founder was informed that one of the items needed to secure quickly for Brandon was a wheel-chair & Mike thought this would be a great mission for a local Danville Boy Scout named Chris Behring.

From the time Mike made the call to Lisa Behring (Dave was out of town) to the time Chris delivered the new wheelchair at the hospital from the Wheelchair Foundation with me, it was only 7 hrs. Chris got home from school at 3 pm, changed into his Scout uniform and off we went. What a kid! Our congratulations & thanks to Chris for his efforts.

Boy Scout Christopher Behring will be leading a team of Scouts at East Bay Stand Down to record interviews for the Library of Congress "Veteran History Project"

A special Eagle Scout Project honoring veterans being conducted at this years East Bay Stand Down has developed into a major sponsorship effort for **Boy Scout Christopher Behring**. Chis planned a multiple approach to helping veterans—first by collecting funds to purchase \$3000 worth of sleeping bags for the homeless veteran program. Due to his dedicated efforts speaking about his project to many service organizations including Rotary Clubs - Chris raised enough funds to purchase all the sleeping bags for the EBSD 2014 event. Chris raised near \$10,000 - as of the recent planning meeting, far exceeding the amount required for the needed 450 sleeping bags. *Congratulations to Boy Scout Chris Behring*.

Chis exceeded his goal and requested EBSD to use additional funds to help these veterans reconnect. This request developed into the purchase of a special event **photo printer** which will be used as part of an **EBSD Photo Booth** taking **photos** of participating displaced veterans during the four-day encampment. This is effort is being combined for the first time with efforts by a law firm volunteering *PeopleMap* software to assist in locating contact information on family members. The objective is to allowing them to make **a phone call home** helping to reconnect & follow-up with a personal letter home including a current photograph in each letter helping them reconnect with family. Primary focus of Chris on-site will be leading a team of Boy Scouts in video interviews of veterans & be sent back to the **Library of Congress**. These interviews will be entered as part of the permanent collection in the "**Veterans History Project**" as the major effort of his Eagle Scout project. **East Bay Stand Down 2014 is honored to have Chris Behring as a volunteer & major sponsor.**






Funeral services are pending.









What is going on with VNVDV Members

Contra Costa Television (CCTV) starts a new feature program— "VETERAN VOICES" and on Monday evening Aug. 18, Joe Callaway, VNVDV Membership Director and Bob Whitworth, both Viet Nam Veterans joined Nathan Johnson, County Veterans Service Officer and Kevin Graves of CALVET on the live broadcast of Veterans Voices of Contra Costa County. Joe and Bob were interviewed about their Viet Nam experience. Training, deployment, in-country Infantry assignments and stateside adjustment after leaving the Army were featured topics. Joe and Bob both were assigned to Infantry Units that trained and deployed as units. Both Joe and Bob entered intensive OJT programs and quickly learned to deal with fear, control, survival and learning. Bob returned to Central California, married and readjusted. Joe returned to Fort Devens, 10th SF near Boston prior to entered College in Boston after leaving the Army. Bob experienced nightmares and Joe expressed some anger and their experiences brought them to the VA where they benefited from a program designed to deal with their PTSD. Joe is the author of "Mekong First Light" and Bob authored "Through My Eyes" and Joe and Bob felt the books were a positive experience. The America Class LHAs will replace the LHA-1, Tarawa Class of amphibious assault ships, and will have the flexibility to operate in the traditional role as the flagship for an Expeditionary Strike Group. She is characterized as an aviation-centric amphibious assault ship designed to accommodate the next generation of Marine Corps aircraft, the MV-22 Osprey and the F-35B (VTOL) Joint Strike Fighter across the full spectrum of military operations. These amphibious warships are uniquely designed to support the U.S. Marines' Aviation Combat Element (ACE) philosophy including assault from the sea against defended positions ashore and Sea Control Air operations using enhanced numbers of strike fighters. The air assault role is optimized for conducting larger air assault operations from much further out, allowing the Ground Combat Element (GCE) to arrive on scene more quickly and the America-class ship to be better protected from its station farther out to sea.

VietNam Veterans *Killed-in-Action* from Contra Costa - Photos still needed for those fallen - *Names on the Wall*

The first time Janna Hoehn visited Washington, D.C., she went to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. Its simple power -- a black granite wall etched with the 58,286 names of U.S. service members killed in the Vietnam War -- left her in tears.

"As you're standing there, you realize your reflection is in this wall," said Hoehn, 58. "You're in there with the soldiers. It made me cry because it's so massive, so many names."

Now she's part of a project that aims to intensify the emotional experience by adding faces to the names. The Faces Never Forgotten project has collected photos for more than 33,000 of the names on the wall, via online submissions from family and friends and through the work of volunteers directed by the nonprofit Vietnam Veterans Fund in Washington, D.C.

The project is the brainchild of Jan Scruggs, a Vietnam veteran who founded the wall. Now he seeks to build an underground education center on the Washington Mall in which to display the photos. (Photos that have been collected are displayed at www.vvmf.org/Wall-of-Faces.)

Legislation authorizing construction of the \$100 million education center was signed in 2003 by President George W. Bush. Scruggs said he has raised approximately \$15 million to date. Recently, Congress granted the project a four-year extension -- through 2017 -- to raise the additional \$85 million.

"We're talking to the right people in the corporate world," said Scruggs, an Army veteran who earned a Purple Heart in Vietnam. "We'll get it done. It will be powerful. We really want this to be done in a tasteful manner to inspire people to appreciate those who have given everything for their country."

Hoehn, a florist on the island of Maui in Hawaii, was part of the Faces Never Forgotten project before she knew it existed. Five years ago, on her visit to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, she traced a random name -- MIA Gregory Crossman -- on a piece of paper. After returning home, her curiosity piqued, she searched online for any information she could find about her mystery service member. Her cousin was able to locate a photo. "I put his picture in a scrapbook," Hoehn said, "and put the scrapbook away."

Then she heard about Faces Never Forgotten. She sent Crossman's photo to Scruggs, who wrote back asking if Hoehn would be willing to locate photos for the 42 dead or missing from her home island. She calls them the "Maui boys." "What I thought would be a simple project was not," she said. "After six months, I had them."

Hoehn then volunteered to find pictures of casualties from Riverside County, where she grew up. Now she's searching Bay Area counties. She uses a number of tools. She started tracking down the "Maui boys" with a phone book. She visited high schools, scanned microfiche in libraries and pored through yearbooks. She got the final photo by knocking on a door in her neighborhood.

Now she works remotely, scouring the Internet and asking local newspapers to write about the project. Her cousin helps, using ancestry.com. For her work in Contra Costa County, Hoehn enlisted the help of the Vietnam Veterans of Diablo Valley.

"I think we'll get most of the photographs," Scruggs said. "By the time we have the center built, we'll probably be in the 80 to 85 percent range. Once it's operational, and people come to see it, that's when we'll get the rest. There's probably one-half of 1 percent you can never get."

The photo Andy Holt cares most about is the one of his older brother, Raymond, who was killed in combat in the Binh Duong province of South Vietnam in 1970, two days after Christmas and 10 days after his 22nd birthday. Andy, Raymond and their three siblings grew up in Antioch.

Andy Holt, who enlisted in the Army with two buddies who were killed in Vietnam, likes the concept of Faces Never Forgotten.

"That sounds great," he said. "The men and women who served in Vietnam, and those who didn't make it back, had a (crummy) deal. It's not like our soldiers today, who come home to a warm welcome. It was just bad all the way around. This is a long time coming."


