Contra Costa, Alameda college campuses carve out space for veteran resource centers



A San Ramon-based nonprofit is working with local businesses & the Contra Costa Community College District to set up spaces on four local college campuses where veterans who've come back to school can gather, learn or simply get away for a little while.

The Student Veterans Resource Centers will be designed to offer transition from military service to civilian life and into higher education and new careers.

The centers are coming to Los Medanos College in Pittsburg and Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill late this year, and to the Contra Costa College campus in San Pablo in Fall 2016. Another center is expected to open at the College of Alameda within the next several weeks, said **Mike Conklin**, CEO and board chairman of the Sentinels of Freedom Scholarship Fund.

The first center backed by **Sentinels of Freedom** opened at San Francisco State in 2012; PG&E was the lead benefactor with that project, Conklin said. His group's main task since forming in 1998 was offering scholarships to returning soldiers with serious battle injuries requiring rehabilitation, and finding them homes and jobs to help with the transition back to civilian life.

Los Medanos President Bob Kratochvil did a survey of the needs of college veterans, asking what they needed to succeed at college. The top answer: a place for vets to gather and help one another.

<u>Above</u>: **Martin Duering** was 18 when he arrived in a replacement camp in Le Havre, France on Dec. 18, 1944. Martin was assigned to the

35th Infantry Division which was in the Third Army. The 35th would moved North from France to engage the German Forces on the Southern shoulder of the Battle of the Bulge. The 35th successfully fought in the relief of the Town of Bastogne, Belgium. Martin was awarded the Bronze Star Medal. Later Martin was assigned to the 5th Infantry Division which continued to engage German forces till Luxembourg was finally liberated in mid February 1945.



<u>Above</u>: **Commander "Diz" Laird** is a member of the American Fighter Aces Association. Cmdr. Laird has the unique distinction of being the only American ace to have recorded kills in two Theatres. While serving on the USS Ranger, a carrier in support of the British, a German Junker was engaged of the coast of Norway and successfully downed. Cmdr. Laird was transferred to the Pacific where he earned four kills of Japanese aircraft. Prior to the end of the war Cmdr. Laird was returned to the States to assume Flight training assignments. Cmdr. Laird has flown just about every fighter and trainer plane the Navy had and continued service through Korea and Viet Nam. After WWII he was assigned to the first Navy jet squadron. At the end of his career Cmdr. Laird was contacted by 20th Century Fox where he was selected as a pilot in the filming of *"Tora, Tora, Tora.*



WORLD WAR II VETERAN RECOGNITION - Ken Hathaway



Ken Hathaway, a resident of Antioch, joined the Navy shortly after the Pearl Harbor attack. Completing basic and gunnery schools, Ken was assigned to cargo ships operated by the Merchant Marine. This included trips to Murmansk, Russia. On 9-10 July 1943 Ken was serving on the Robert Rowan in support of the Invasion of Sicily. German Junker 88 bombers attacked the Robert Rowan and successfully hit the Liberty Ship with three bombs before being driven off by Ken Hathaway's gunnery crews who were credited with downing two enemy aircraft. The Robert Rowan carried fuel and ammunition and sunk without any casualties after a spectacular explosion. Ken Hathaway received commendations for his direction of the Robert Rowan defense. Ken remained in the Navy to the end of 1951 and continued in the reserves for another four years. *Article & information prepared by editor - Jon Robbins*






