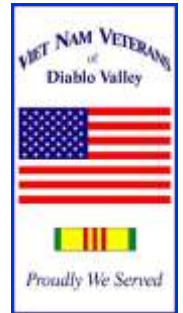

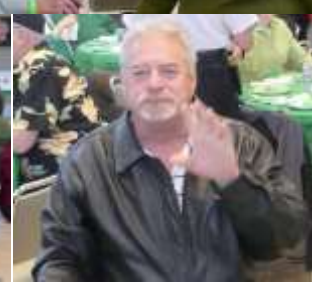

Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pins

The Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin has become “a lasting memento of the Nation’s thanks.” Living U.S. Veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time during the period of November 1, 1955, to May 15, 1975, regardless of location, are eligible to receive one lapel pin.

Normally, these lapel pins are presented during a dignified, public ceremony to individual Vietnam Veterans. However, given the global pandemic, most commemorative events have been postponed, while others have been rescheduled for next year.

As a unique alternative during this challenging period, The Vietnam War Commemoration is encouraging Vietnam Veterans to submit a request for their lapel pin via email at whs.vnwar50th_events@mail.mil. At the earliest opportunity, Veterans will receive a lapel pin in the mail.

Who does Vietnam War Commemoration Honor?

U.S. Armed Forces personnel with active duty service between November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location of service which includes:

Nine million Americans serving during that time

6.4 million Americans living today

2.7 million U.S. service members who served in Vietnam

58,000 whose names are memorialized on a black granite wall in our Nation’s capital

304,000 who were wounded

1,253 Missing in Action (MIA) heroes who have not yet returned to American soil

2,500 [Prisoners of War](#) (POWs)

The commemoration makes no distinction between veterans who served in-country, in-theater, or were stationed elsewhere during those 20 year

Presidential Proclamation Regarding Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017

“To ensure the sacrifices of the 9 million heroes who served during this difficult chapter of our country’s history are remembered for generations to come, I signed into law the Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017, designating March 29 of each year as National Vietnam War Veterans Day. Throughout this Commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War, and every March 29 thereafter, we will honor all those who answered our Nation’s call to duty.” -President Trump

ABOUT SENTINELS OF FREEDOM

The idea for Sentinels of Freedom began when my son, Kyle was wounded after his M1088 was hit by a rocket-propelled grenade (RPG) in Iraq. While treating him in the hospital, I spoke with others who were also wounded. I realized the tremendous physical and emotional hurdles these war-torn men and women face when transitioning to civilian life.

Founded in 2007, Sentinels of Freedom has become a community of partners focused on "closing the gaps" for severely wounded, post-9/11 veterans. The mission of SOF is to assist them as they overcome their higher education and successfully transition to civilian life. We call our program participants "Sentinels" in honor of their sacrifice in guarding American freedoms. As their advocates, we attribute our success to how we provide structure and long-term accountability for highly motivated veterans while they pursue their education and personal goals.

Supporting them is not charity; it is an investment. So far, we have served over 627 veterans in 44 states. This year our budget will be \$2.2 million, and our goal is to bring on 100 new Sentinels into our Bridge for Education program. We proudly report that 90% of every dollar raised is applied directly to our Sentinel. Charon, Navigator raises Sentinels of Freedom as an exceptional four-star charity that "exceeds industry standards and outperforms most programs in its cause." In 2021, we received the Outdoor Planning Seal of Transparency.

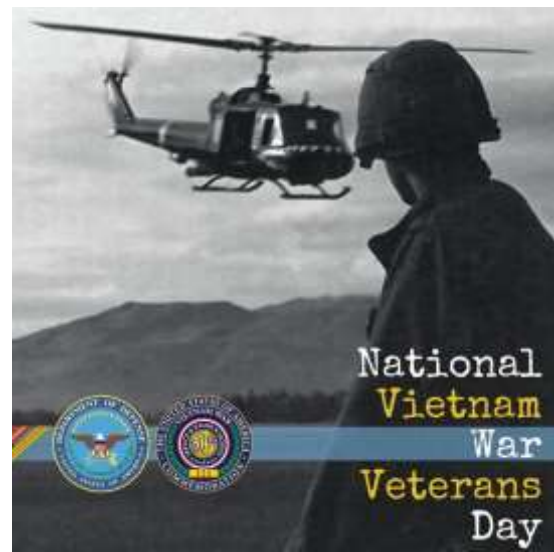

“LAST DAYS IN VIETNAM”

This PBS production depicts the final days of the war in April 1975 as North Vietnamese forces moved into Saigon. U.S. involvement had ended two years earlier in 1973 when we withdrew all combat forces. The American government continued to provide aid and supplies to the South Vietnamese government through this period. The only American forces still in Vietnam during the final days were the Marines who were guarding the U.S. Embassy. This film includes footage and interviews with Americans and Vietnamese who experienced the hurried scramble to evacuate Embassy personnel and South Vietnamese civilians who hoped to leave the country and make it to the U.S. Only a small fraction made it out.

Director Rory Kennedy did an excellent job of presenting a detailed summary of these final days.

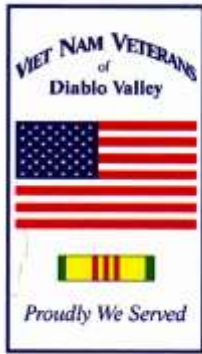

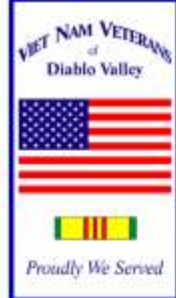
