








Thanks to the August speaker *TIM SAMMONS* for his discussion of the history of PTF boats and their operation in the Gulf of Tonkin during the Vietnam.



Military Assistance Command Vietnam "Studies and Observations Group"

- The <u>CIA</u> was running covert ops in SEA, including maritime ops, in the late 1950's, early 60's.
- Civilian & FT Boat Ops were run from Dalkang with <u>Vietnamese</u> RVN Navy crews when <u>north</u> of the DMZ.
- MACVSOG took over direction of these operations in the Tookin Gulf from the CIA in January 1964.
- PTF's were involved in the Tonkin Gulf Incident(s) during coastal raids, Jul & Aug 1964.

SUICIDE PREVENTION: VA'S INTEGRATED APPROACH

Enhanced Care Delivery:

Identify and manage Veterans at high risk of suicide.

Access and Referral:

- Follow-up on all calls to the Veterans Crisis Line from East Bay Service Area.
- Expedite medical and mental health treatment for Veterans at high risk of suicide.

Memos, Directives and Admin Items:

- Implement National Office directives regarding suicide prevention practices at a local level.
- In conjunction with other departments in the East Bay Division, assists in developing standard
 operating procedures of best practices in working with Veterans at high risk.

Outreach and Awareness:

- Assist Veterans in dealing with crisis by increasing awareness of the Veterans Crisis Line and its services.
- Reach out to Veterans informing them about the medical and mental health services available.

Training:

- Train all VA staff in all departments on suicide prevention practices and suicide risk assessment.
- Offer training to community mental health providers on suicide prevention, risk assessment and how to refer Veterans to the VA for treatment.

Evaluation and Research:

 Participate in nation-wide research effort; reporting, analyzing and interpreting data related to suicide prevention from NCHCS to our national office in order to develop more effective suicide prevention efforts.



<u>Animal Rescue Foundation (Veterans' Clinic)</u> Wellness Clinic for Veterans' Pets

Free veterinary wellness care is available through our **in-house clinic** on Wednesdays - <u>by appointment</u> <u>only</u>. For information or to schedule an appointment, Veterans may call (925) 296-3125 (option 7) and leave a message – Name, Pet name, type, & your contact information. Clinic staff will call you back for scheduling.

Clinics are open to dogs and cats belonging to Veterans of any era (up to two pets per visit). **No non-military civilians will be accepted.** Clients must furnish valid military identification at the time of check-in. Acceptable forms of military identification include military I.D. card, VA health identification photo card, discharge paperwork with matching photo identification, or Department of Defense Form 214 with matching photo identification.

Wellness Clinic FAQs

How do I Make an Appointment to Receive Services?

Our wellness clinics for Veterans' pets are by appointment only. For information or to schedule an appointment, Veterans may call (925) 296-3125 (option 7) and leave a message. Clinic staff will call you back for scheduling.

What Services Does ARF's Clinic Offer to Veterans?

Complimentary services provided include:

- Annual wellness exam
- Vaccines
- Heartworm testing for dogs
- FeLV/FIV testing for cats
- · Year-round flea, tick, and parasite preventative products
- · Spay and neuter (by appointment, clients must visit our wellness clinic for exam first)

Where do I Go for My Appointment?

Our Veterans clinic entrance can be found past the main adoption entrance and spay/neuter clinic entrance,

What Can I Expect from My Appointment?

If you are a new client, your Veterans' ID will be checked, and you will be given an information form to fill out about your pet(s). Dogs must be on leash and under control at all times. Cats must be in carriers.

Are There Limits on How Many Pets Can be Seen?

In order to serve as many Veterans as possible, we limit services to two pets per household per clinic and we provide services to a lifetime maximum of six pets per veterans' household.

Schedule of Events for Veterans

ARF conducts Wellness Clinics for Veterans' Pet at ARF Headquarters in Walnut Creek on Wednesdays. <u>Appointment Required. NOTE</u>: Currently ARF is <u>not</u> conducting their Mobile Clinic for Veterans' pets at the **Martinez** VA Medical Centers.

ARF is conducting their Mobile Clinic for Veterans' pets at the Livermore Medical Center on the second Wednesday each month.

Each month ARF will publish a schedule for the new month on ARFIife.org website.

Nominations Open for Viet Nam Veterans of Diablo Valley 2024 Officers & Board of Directors Election at November 2nd Meeting

Nominations are OPEN for 2023 Officers & Directors - as announced at the September Membership Dinner Meeting & mentioned in the INCOMING News. President Steve Burchik appointed Past President Dennis Giacovelli as Chair of the Recruitment & Nomination Committee for 2023. He also appointed Dave Smith to serve as official member of the 2023 committee for the Election of Officers & Directors for the VNVDV. Past President Dennis Giacovelli expressed he is *looking for a few good men...* to serve on the Board in 2024. The President needs a solid team behind him... so all members are encouraged to find out more about these positions from any of these Past Presidents... Jerry Yahiro - Mike Weber or Rich Lambert. The Official Ballots will be distributed at the November 2nd dinner meeting with the names of those nominated to-date. You can nominate yourself - or members can nominate other current members in good standing. The Election Committee has received nominations for each position and encourages members to find out about each leadership role and become involved in our Board of Directors meetings. All positions are OPEN and we encourage members to run for whatever position they desire by notifying the Nomination Selection Committee by e-mail (please copy Election Committee members). The duties & responsibilities of all "Officers & Directors" positions listed above are outlined in our organizational by-laws. We encourage new members - as well and those now with time available - to attend our October Board of Directors meetings this month on the 3rd Thursday of each month at the Danville Veteran's Memorial Building at 1800. This is a good way to find out what each position is responsible for and gives you a better understanding and background of the organization. All members are welcome to attend any Board meeting. If you have questions about the positions speak one of the members of the nomination/election committee. Co-Chairs and Assistants are "*appointed*" by the President - and are needed in most areas. This is a great way to learn about the duties - help in a significant way - and keep our organization strong & active in helping fellow veterans - those serving and our community. **Past President Jerry Yahiro noted...** "*The quality of an organization depends on its current leaders' and the members' willingness to participate in the administration of the organization."* We encourage all members to "strongly consider" becoming <u>more active & involved</u> in "the program of your choice" in our organization.

President Steve Burchik previously indicated there are many enjoyable positions to serve - making a difference in the direction of this amazing organization and he strongly encourages all members to consider joining the 2024 team which he promises will be another fun & exciting year. Our events & activities are so varied... there is truly something for everybody! You can make a difference. Join the team.

<u>5 Year Transition Plan-**VNVDV**</u>

OBJECTIVE: Plan for an orderly transition of VNVDV organization and activities as age and medical issues impact member's abilities to maintain current levels of activity.

TRANSITION PLAN: The general transition plan is to change our legal status from the current IRS 501 (c19) organization to a strictly social organization of Vietnam Veterans.

TIMING OF CHANGE: The transition to a social organization does not have a specific date. It will occur when we no longer have enough volunteers to conduct fundraising activities; manage the administrative activities of the group; and provide the manpower for public events such as Memorial Day gatherings or Parades.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The IRS rules require that a nonprofit organization must transfer all remaining assets to another nonprofit organization at the time of dissolution. No decision is being made at this time, but there is some interest in transferring any remaining funds to the Veterans Memorial Building in Danville. The VNVDV Board that is in office at the time of this change will make the decision on what group(s) receive these funds.

MONTHLY DINNER MEETINGS: Since the monthly Dinner Meetings are the most widely attended activity by VNVDV members the plan is to continue to conduct these meetings as long as members are willing and able to attend. A recent poll of the members indicated that the majority prefer to continue meeting at an evening event. That, however, could change in the near future as more members find it difficult to drive at night and the meeting could move to a lunch time event. As it becomes more difficult to meet the minimum attendance requirements of catered venues, we may move to a conventional restaurant with a group room that has no fixed rental charge.

FUNDRAISING PROJECTS: Our operating funds currently come from two sources: Crab Feed and the Walk of Honor. Both events are at risk in the near future. The Crab Feed requires a great deal of manpower, especially in the solicitation and management of donations. New Volunteers are not stepping up in the numbers that are needed to make this event worthwhile in the coming years. The Walk of Honor depends on the manpower and financial support of Phillips 66 which is a publicly traded corporation. Corporations can change their priorities quickly based on market conditions and their support can shift to some other community project on short notice. Also, we are in need of New Volunteers to make this event successful.

COMMUNITY MANPOWER SUPPORT: We need large numbers of Volunteers for public events such as Parades, Memorial Day events, Veterans Day events etc. The average age of our members is currently 78 ¹/₂ years old. Will you still be willing to carry a flag for one or two miles in two years or four years?

COMMUNITY FINANCIAL SUPPORT: We support various community groups financially, such as Blue Star Moms, Wheelchair Foundation, Sentinels of Freedom, Veterans Service Office, etc. The funds we disperse depend on the funds we raise. As our fundraising ability diminishes, our disbursements will also have to shrink.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: This program is off to a great start and we would like to keep it going as a "Legacy" project. We will consider making a contribution to some type of trust to provide funds for the future depending on the advice of an attorney.

TRANSITION TO YOUNGER VETS: Attempts have been made to attract younger Veterans, but without much success. They find it hard to relate to us and don't see a connection between Iraq and Vietnam. We are working actively to develop a stronger Veterans Group at Diablo Valley College and will continue to do this while we still have some funds to support them.
